These awards will be presented at the OACP Awards and Life Members' Luncheon on Wednesday, June 16 in Kingston during the OACP Annual Conference and Global Showcase.

The OACP Traffic Safety Award of Excellence is presented to a police officer whose duties may not be exclusively devoted to traffic safety but nevertheless has consistently sought to promote traffic safety in performing their duties.

This inaugural award will be presented to **Constable Christopher Riley** of the London Police Service.

The OACP Lifetime Achievement in Traffic Safety Award is presented to a serving police officer who has devoted him or herself throughout their career to traffic safety initiatives.

This year's award will be presented to **Staff Sergeant Bradley Bulmer** of York Regional Police.

The OACP Traffic Safety Initiative of the Year Awards (Police Services with More Than 500 Police Officers) will be awarded to **Halton Regional Police Service** for the *Traffic Services Restructuring Program*.

The OACP Traffic Safety Initiative of the Year Awards (Police Services with Less Than 500 Police Officers) will be awarded to **Owen Sound Police Service** for its *Web Site Traffic Safety Strategy*.
